Abstract

The number of colleges and universities in most developing countries has increased drastically over the past decades. The quality variation of these institutions is an alarming concern. Quality assurance programs are proposed and implemented. This paper evaluates the effects of quality assurance on the demand for college education, study abroad, and the brain drain. It is found that the program discourages individuals from studying abroad and alleviating the brain drain problems. The demand for college education increases if fewer individuals elect to study abroad. Otherwise, the demand for college will decrease. The effect on social welfare, however, cannot be unambiguously determined.
