諾貝爾經濟學得獎者 約瑟夫·斯蒂格利茲教授 主講2005年榮譽學人講座－ 「公平貿易－世界貿易 組織的角色」

Professor Joseph E. STIGLITZ Discusses “Fair Trade for All – the Role of WTO” in the Lingnan University Distinguished Scholar Lecture 2005

嶺南大學於2005年12月舉行「嶺南大學2005年榮譽學人講座」，由2001年諾貝爾經濟學得獎者、現任教於哥倫比亞大學的約瑟夫·斯蒂格利茲教授主講，講題為「公平貿易－世界貿易組織的角色」。講座反應熱烈，座無虛席，除嶺大校長陳坤耀教授、校董會成員、嶺大教職員外，出席的嘉賓還包括政府代表、商界專業人士、香港各大專院校代表、中學校長及老師，以及社會各界人士，可見斯蒂格利茲教授的魅力非凡。

斯蒂格利茲教授於席上闡述全球貿易體制應如何改革，才可真正促進貿易發展，並提出多個具體方案，以達至全球貿易體制更顯公平外，並可望能促進整體發展。

斯蒂格利茲教授是備受國際推崇的經濟學教育家，於麻省理工學院(MIT)完成博士課程，曾先後受聘於耶魯、普林斯頓、牛津和史丹福等大學，並曾出任美國總統經濟顧問委員會成員及世界銀行資深副總裁和首席經濟師。他於2000年創立了「主動政策對話」組織，協助發展中國家探索政策方案，並於2004年出任《經濟學人之聲》編輯。斯蒂格利茲教授經常對主流或傳統思想提出大膽創新的挑戰，其個人著作甚豐，並發表了超過300篇學術論文。①

“Fair Trade for All – the Role of WTO” was the title of Lingnan University’s Distinguished Scholar Lecture 2005, which was delivered at a luncheon in December 2005 by Prof. Joseph E. STIGLITZ, a Nobel Laureate in Economic Sciences and a Professor at Columbia University.

The wide range of people who attended the lecture and the enthusiasm with which it was received fully demonstrated the speaker’s charisma. The audience included Lingnan’s President, Prof. Edward CHEN, Council members, and academic and administrative staff, as well as a host of representatives from the Government, business, professional, tertiary and secondary education sectors.

Prof. Stiglitz examined various reforms to promote trade development,

and advocated a number of solutions that would help make the global trading regime more equitable and capable of supporting growth.

Prof. Stiglitz received his PhD from Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT) and subsequently taught at Yale, Princeton, Oxford and Stanford universities. He joined the Council of Economic Advisors in 1993, and he was the World Bank’s Senior Vice-President and Chief Economist from 1997 to 2000. In 2000, Prof. Stiglitz founded The Initiative for Policy Dialogue (IPD) to help developing countries explore policy alternatives. In 2004, he became editor of *The Economist’s Voice*. Prof. Stiglitz is well known for his bold ideas, which challenge mainstream, conventional concepts. He has published many works and been referred to in more than 300 papers. ①
