# **Brief Course Description:**

This course introduces students to the development of modern Chinese literature from 1917 to the 1930's.

### Aims:

This course studies modern Chinese literature in terms of its historical background, ideological content, classical links, artistic development and achievement, as well as foreign influences on it.

## **Learning Outcomes:**

Upon completion of this course, students will be able to achieve the followings:

- 1. Understand the general history of modern Chinese literature
- 2. Describe the characteristics of different literary schools and styles of major writers
- 3. Demonstrate analytical skills and critical thinking ability.

### **Indicative Content:**

- Historical background of modern Chinese literature: Late-Qing literature; political and social revolution; developments in the language of literature 中國現 代文學的歷史背景:晚清文學、政治及社會革命和文學語言的變化及發展
- The May-Fourth literary revolution: Hu Shi and Chen Duxiu「五四」文學革命: 胡適與陳獨秀的文學主張
- Lu Xun's influence on the development of modern Chinese literature 魯迅對中國 現代文學發展的影響
- The Literary Association: Ye Shengtao, Bingxin, Xu Dishan 文學研究會:葉聖 陶、謝冰心、許地山
- 5) The Creation Society and Yu Dafu's works 創造社與郁達夫的創作
- 6) Literature of the female writers in the 20s: Ling Shuhua, Lu Yin, Ding Ling 二十 年代的女性文學:凌叔華、盧隱、丁玲

# **Teaching Method:**

2 hours of lecture and 1 hour of tutorial per week. Basic literary concepts and important developments in modern Chinese literature will be introduced in lectures. Students are required to study assigned materials and present their findings in tutorials.

### **Measurement of Learning Outcomes:**

- 1. Grading is by continuous assessment (40%, including tutorial performance and written reports) and examination (60%).
- 2. Examination (60%): Students are required to show their abilities of integration, critical and analytical thinking in answering essay type of questions (LO1, LO2).
- 3. Tutorial presentation (10%): Students should facilitate fruitful discussions and debates in tutorial groups (LO1).
- 4. Tutorial reports or essays (30%): Students are expected to incorporate comments and feedbacks of teachers and group-mates for the revision of their written reports. Students need to submit written reports or essays for assessment (LO3).

Examination: 60% Continuous assessment: 40%
