Course Title : Selected Readings in Classical Chinese

Literary Masterpieces 中國古典文學名著選讀

Brief Course Description:

This course introduces students to the study of selected masterpieces of Chinese classical literature.

Aims:

The main objective of this course is to familiarize students with some of the masterpieces in classical Chinese literature, so that they may develop a better insight in literary study. Students will be trained in writing short reviews or appreciations in order to develop their critical thinking and practice in book-review writing.

Learning Outcomes:

Upon completion of this course, students will be able to

- 1. analyze masterpieces of classical Chinese literature independently;
- 2. demonstrate knowledge of classical Chinese literature;
- 3. possess skills of appreciation of classical Chinese literature;
- 4. demonstrate critical and analytical thinking in the process of literary appreciation.

Indicative Content:

- 1) Selected readings of Zhuangzi《莊子》簡介及選讀
- 2) Selected readings of Wen xuan《文選》簡介及選讀
- 3) Selected readings of Tang-Song classical prose 唐宋八大家古文選讀
- 4) Selected readings of Tongcheng prose 桐城派古文選讀
- 5) Selected readings of poetry-criticism poetry 論詩詩選讀
- 6) Selected readings from Yuanshi 葉燮《原詩》簡介及選讀
- 7) Selected readings of *huaben stories* 話本選讀

8) Selected readings of Rulin Waishi《儒林外史》簡介及選讀

Measurement of Learning Outcomes:

- 1. Grading is by continuous assessment (40%, including tutorial performance and written reports) and examination (60%).
- 2. Examination (60%): Students should demonstrate their knowledge of the selected masterpieces of classical Chinese literature. In addition, they are required to show abilities of integration, critical and analytical thinking in answering essay type of questions (LO1, LO2, LO3, LO4).
- 3. Tutorial presentation (10%): Students can integrate knowledge and technique they have acquired in mass lectures for the use of their tutorial presentations. They should also facilitate fruitful discussions and debates in tutorial groups.(LO1,LO4)
- 4. Tutorial reports or essays (30%): Students are expected to incorporate comments and feedbacks of teachers and group-mates for the revision of their written reports. Students need to submit written reports or essays for assessment.(LO1,LO2,LO3,LO4)
