Course Title : Classical Chinese Prose

Teaching Hours : 2 hours lecture per week

1 hour tutorial per week

Category in Major Programme: Elective

Prerequisite : Nil

Brief Course Description:

This course introduces students to the study of classical Chinese prose.

Aims:

This course aims at to survey the historical development of Chinese prose by familiarizing students with the historical background, subject matter as well as writing techniques of major pieces of classical Chinese prose.

Learning Outcomes:

Upon completion of this course, students will be able to achieve the followings:

- 1. show considerable knowledge in classical Chinese prose according to historical changes, literary movements and authors' creativity;
- 2. demonstration of the ability to study classical Chinese prose;
- 3. demonstration of the ability of literary appreciation of classical Chinese prose;
- 4. demonstration of analytical skills and critical thinking ability.

Indicative Content:

- 1) Period of pragmatism: prose since pre-Qin and *The Book of the Great Historian* 實用性階段:從先秦散文到《史記》
- 2) Period of formalism: from "fu" of Han to the parallel prose of Six Dynasties 形式化階段: 從漢賦到六朝駢體散文
- 3) Period of liberation: development and maturation of prose from Tang to Song 自由化階段: 唐宋古文的發展和成熟
- 4) Period of imitation and exploration: schools of prose in Ming and Qing dynasties 因襲與探索階段:明清散文的流派

Teaching Method:

2 hours of lecture and 1 hour of tutorial per week. In lectures, emphasis will be placed on the historical development of Chinese prose. Students should be acquainted with the background, themes and techniques of representative pieces of prose. In lectures and tutorials, different styles of prose in different periods will be discussed.

Measurement of Learning Outcomes:

- 1. Grading is by continuous assessment (40%, including written report and performance in tutorial) and examination (60%).
- 2. Students have to submit a written report to reflect their skills in comparing and criticizing a variety of prose written by authors of different periods. They should show considerable knowledge of the subject in continuous assessment (tutorials and discussions) (40%) (LO1, LO2, LO3, LO4).
- 3. Tutorial presentation (10%): Students should facilitate fruitful discussions and debates in tutorial groups (LO1, LO2, LO3).
- 4. Tutorial reports or essays (30%): Students are expected to incorporate comments and feedbacks of teachers and group-mates for the revision of their written reports. Students need to submit written reports or essays for assessment (LO2, LO3, LO4).
- 5. Examination (60%): Students are required to show their abilities of integration, critical and analytical thinking in answering essay type of questions (LO1, LO2, LO3, LO4).
