# **Brief Course Description:**

This course introduces students to the study of important works of world literature of the 19<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup> century.

#### Aims:

Modern Chinese literature has been greatly influenced by world literature. The aim of this course is to familiarize students with important works of world literature from the perspective of modern literary movement. The course will enrich students' understanding on world literature of the 19<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup> century.

## **Learning Outcomes:**

Upon completion of this course, students will be able to:

- 1. attain knowledge of world literature;
- 2. interpret, evaluate and analyze the literary works covered using a variety of critical perspectives.

#### **Indicative Content:**

- 1. Selected readings on Realism 寫實主義文學選讀
- 2. Selected readings on Naturalism 自然主義文學選讀
- 3. Selected readings on Symbolism 象徵主義文學選讀
- 4. Selected readings on Modernism 現代主義文學選讀
- 5. Selected readings from the Beat Generation 美國地下文學選讀
- 6. Selected readings on Magic Realism 魔幻寫實主義文學選讀
- 7. Selected readings on Nouveau roman 法國新小說選讀

### **Teaching Method:**

2 hours of lecture and 1 hour of tutorial per week. Selected readings would be

discussed and analyzed in mass lectures. Presentation, discussion and report-submission would be incorporated in tutorial teaching.

#### **Measurement of Learning Outcomes:**

- 1. Grading is by continuous assessment (40%, including tutorial performance and written reports) and examination (60%).
- 2. Examination (60%): Students should demonstrate their knowledge of the topic selected. In addition, they are required to show abilities of integration, critical and analytical thinking in answering essay type of questions (LO1, LO2).
- 3. Tutorial presentation (10%): Students can integrate knowledge they have acquired in mass lecture for the use of their tutorial presentations. They should also facilitate fruitful discussion and debates in tutorials (LO1, LO2).
- 4. Tutorial reports or essays (30%): Students are expected to incorporate comments and feedbacks of teachers and group-mates for the revision of their written reports. Students need to submit written reports for essays for assessment (LO1, LO2).

#### **Assessment:**

Examination: 60% One 2-hour paper

Continuous assessment: 40%
