Brief Course Description:

This course introduces students to the basic tenets of Buddhism. The course will discuss the special features of Buddhism as a religion, as well as its influence on Chinese literature.

Aims:

This course introduces students to some basic concepts in Buddhism, to the historical development of Buddhism in China, and to its influence on Chinese literature and literary criticism.

Learning Outcomes:

Upon completion of this course, students will be able to:

- 1. gain have demonstrated knowledge of the influence of Buddhism in Chinese literature;
- 2. read a broad range of Buddhist texts along with literary works;
- 3. engage a meaningful dialogue between religion and literature as to demonstrate their understanding of both;
- 4. demonstrate their critical thinking ability.

Indicative Content:

- 1. Origins of Buddhism and its transmission to the East 佛教之起源及其東傳
- 2. Development of Chinese Buddhism from the Six Dynasties to the Sui-Tang period 六朝到隋唐佛教之發展
- 3. Buddhism and Tang bianwen 唐代俗講及變文
- Buddhist stories and themes in Chinese fiction and drama 佛經故事與中國小說戲曲之題材內容
- 5. Chan Buddhism in the Tang-Song period 唐、宋禪宗的發展

- 6. Chan Poetry and Criticism 禪詩與詩禪
- Selected Readings of Buddhist texts: *Diamond Sutra* and *Vimalakirti Sutra* 《金剛經》及《維摩詰經》選讀
- 8. Selected Readings in *Monk Zhao's Treatises* and the *Platform Sutra* 《肇論》及《六祖壇經》選讀

Teaching Method:

2 hours of lecture and 1 hour of tutorial per week. Students will do the analysis and discussion of assigned topics in tutorials.

Measurement of Learning Outcomes:

- 1. Grading is by continuous assessment (40%, including essay-writing and tutorial performance) and examination (60%).
- 2. Tutorial presentation (10%): Students are required to have completed all assigned readings before coming to class. They will be invited to answer questions and give comments in tutorials. (LO1,LO2,LO3,LO4)
- 3. Tutorial essay-writing (30%): Students are asked to make formal presentations during the tutorial sessions and hand in their tutorial papers based on their presentations. (LO1,LO2,LO3,LO4)
- 4. Examination (LO1, LO2, LO3, LO4)
