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▼ **Q7: What are the entry arrangements for Mainland students who are approved to take up their studies in Hong Kong?**

If the applicant is a Chinese resident from the Mainland, please contact the admitting education institutions to process the payment and collection of the "e-Visa". After the applicant is issued with an "e-Visa", he/she should apply for an Exit-entry Permit for Travelling to and from Hong Kong and Macao (EEP) and a relevant exit endorsement from the relevant Mainland authorities. The applicant's EEP bearing the relevant exit endorsement should be presented together with the "e-Visa" issued to him/her for immigration arrival clearance.

▼ **Q8: Can I presented my PRC passport together with the issued "e-Visa" for immigration arrival clearance instead of my EEP?**

You should follow the procedures mentioned at [A7](#).

Remarks: Students should use their student visa (applied via Lingnan University) to study in Hong Kong. Please contact the Registry if you have any questions about the visa application.
