Tying in the Food Delivery Market

Abstract:

We study tying and its implications in a platform economy using the case of Hong Kong's food delivery market. By "requiring restaurants which use food delivery services to also use order-to-pickup services", a delivery platform may obtain unfair advantages against partnering restaurants and competing platforms. We first build a theory model to demonstrate tying's impact on restaurants. Using consumer order data, we conduct structural estimation to uncover the welfare consequence of such tying practices.
