Council Chairman Mr Andrew Yao, President Prof Leonard K Cheng, Honorary Fellows, faculty and members of the Lingnan community, and distinguished guests:

First of all, I would like to express my heartfelt gratitude to Lingnan University for conferring these honorary fellowships on Mr Nicholas Brooke, Mr David Kwok, Mr Michael Ngai and myself; it is my greatest honour to be able to deliver this speech on behalf of my fellow awardees here.

Today, as recipients of the Honorary Fellowship, we are extremely proud to pronounce ourselves "official Lingnanians". Despite its modest scale, Lingnan is for sure a leading brand in the development of education in Hong Kong and China. In recent years, under the leadership of Chairman Mr Andrew Yao and President Professor Leonard Cheng, the University has achieved extraordinary accomplishments which have earned worldwide recognition. In the Times Higher Education University Impact Rankings 2021, Lingnan University was ranked third globally for "Quality Education" out of more than 1,000 universities, and this result is an accurate reflection of Lingnanians' characteristic: perseverance in the pursuit of quality education. In my days serving Lingnan, I felt deeply that all Lingnanians – be they professors, staff members, alumni, or members of the Court and Council – worked assiduously to bring quality teaching and continuous improvement in all fields, prioritising the well-being of students, and never compromising on the value of education. The three worthy individuals who have received honorary fellowships today, including Mr Nicholas Brooke, Mr David Kwok and Mr Michael Ngai, are indeed fine examples of Lingnanians. Having made outstanding contributions to the real estate, banking and financial industries which are pillars of Hong Kong's economy, they have upheld professionalism, conscientiously worked to attain concrete achievements, and, in the continuous pursuit of excellence in their work, they are all esteemed industry leaders. Guided by their international vision and love for Hong Kong, they have devoted themselves to altruistic service, and contributed significantly to education, youth service, environmental protection, and technological innovation, as well as the arts and culture. Just like Lingnan University, their willingness to enrich the young and lead by example has made them role models for "quality education" within their industries, providing a substantial input into nurturing talents to benefit the society!
