Brief Course Description

The senior thesis allows students to build upon/modify the research topic and design that they have worked in the Junior Research Project course. They will be given the opportunity to apply theories, research tools and techniques to implement the research and write up an independent thesis on their chosen topic.

Aims

This course aims to:

1. enhance students' ability to utilise research skills to study intellectually challenging topics; and
2. provide students' opportunity to produce a research report on a topic of their choice.

Learning Outcomes (LOs)

Upon successful completion of this course, students will be able to:

1. plan and organise a research design on a specific research topic within a manageable scope and time frame;
2. implement data collection, critically analyse data and present relevant findings in a clear, organised and informative manner; and
3. produce a well-organised, coherent and lucid thesis.

Indicative Contents

Students are required to implement the research proposal they developed from their Junior Research Project course and produce a research report that is in line with the conventions of academic writing.

Teaching Method

There are no lectures and tutorials for this course. Instead, each student will find an academic staff to serve as his/her supervisor and work on one-to-one basis to produce an independent research report.

Measurement of Learning Outcomes

Learning outcomes are measured by the assessment criteria as follows:

1. Final thesis report (100%) (LOs 1-3)

The completed Senior Thesis will be assessed by the supervisor using the following criteria: adequacy of research questions and theory/conceptualisation; application of methodology, organisation of materials and exhaustiveness of research design; adequacy of data analysis, interpretation and logical consistency; clarity of presentation and report writing skills.

Assessment

Continuous assessment : 100% (final thesis report - 100%)

Important Reminder
