Unique aspects of the university:

In 1964, three founding colleges - the Ontario Agricultural College, Ontario Veterinary College and Macdonald Institute - were combined to create the University of Guelph. Situated in southwestern Ontario, our beautiful 330-hectare campus supports a community of over 20,500 undergraduate and 2500 graduate students, including over 1200 international students from around the world. Our students benefit from an innovative curriculum that spans the arts, humanities, commerce, physical and natural sciences, and social sciences. The University has over 800 full-time faculty and students are also supported by more than 2,100 full-time staff. University of Guelph is consistently ranked as one of Canada's top comprehensive universities due to our commitment to student success and innovative research. In recent International Student Barometer surveys, U of G ranked No. 1 for overall learning, living and student support, and had the highest overall average among participating universities in Ontario and Canada. www.uoguelph.ca

The City of Guelph is a vibrant community of 131,000 people with a lively downtown, great shopping and a dynamic cultural scene. Surrounded by rolling hills, Guelph is only a one-hour drive or bus ride from Toronto. The city is very student-friendly, with easy public transportation and a welcoming community feeling. Exchange Nomination and Application

Nomination process	Host universities should nominate students via the online nomination link, which will be sent to you prior to the following deadlines. <u><i>Nomination deadlines:</i></u> Fall semester (September entry) – March 20 Winter semester (January entry) – March 20
Application process	After being nominated by their home university, students will receive an email directly from the University of Guelph inviting them to fill in an online application. <u><i>Application deadlines:</i></u> Fall semester (September to December) – April 15 Winter semester (January - April) – April 15
English proficiency	No proof of English proficiency is required for incoming exchange students, but it is expected that the home university will nominate students who have adequate English skills to be successful in university level courses in English. As a guideline, the English proficiency requirements for full-degree students.

Academics

University academic strengths	Historically, the University of Guelph is best known for its veterinary and agricultural research. Programs that are popular with exchange students are Business, Marketing & Consumer Studies, Hospitality & Tourism Management, Engineering, Food Science, and a range of Science, Arts and Social Science courses.
Courses offered	Undergraduate: www.uoguelph.ca/registrar/calendars/undergraduate/current/c12/index.shtml Graduate: www.uoguelph.ca/registrar/calendars/graduate/current/apdx/index.shtml Courses with "F" at the end are usually held in Fall Courses with "W" at the end are usually held in Winter Courses with "U" at the end are offered occasionally
Credit system	A full-time course load for undergraduate students at University of Guelph is 2.0 to 2.5 credits. Most U of G courses are 0.5 credits each, so students usually take 4 to 5 courses per semester. Graduate students usually take 1 - 3 courses per semester (0.5 - 1.5 credits). It is ultimately up to your home university to decide the credit equivalency for the courses you will be taking.
Credits in ECTS	It is up to your home university to evaluate the credit equivalency for the courses you take while on exchange. However, many universities in Europe use the following conversion: 2.5 University of Guelph credits (usually = 5 courses per semester) = 30 ECTS 0.5 credit course = 6 ECTS
