ACADEMIC PROGRAM INFORMATION

Al Akhawayn University in Ifrane is an independent, public, not-for-profit, coeducational, Moroccan university committed to educating future citizen-leaders of Morocco and the world through a globally oriented, English-language, liberal arts curriculum based on the American system. The University enhances Morocco and engages the world through leading-edge educational and research programs, including continuing and executive education, upholding the highest academic and ethical standards, and promoting equity and social responsibility.

Al Akhawayn University follows a North American Curriculum.
Normal Course Load: **15 Credits (5 classes) / 1 Course = 3 scholastic credit hours (SCH) 1 SCH = 15 contact hours. Minimum Credits per semester: 12 undergraduate, 9 graduates.**

Semester/Program Timeline (see Academic Calendar online)

- **Semester 1 (Fall):** End of August/Beginning of September to 3rd week of December
- **Semester 2 (Spring):** Mid-January to 3rd week of May

APPLICATION DEADLINES FOR EXCHANGE OR STUDY ABROAD

- **Semester 1 (Fall):** 01 March (nominations), 15 March (online applications)
- **Semester 2 (Spring):** 01 October (nominations), 15 October (online application)

The learning environment is as follows:

- **Orientation:** Mandatory
- **Class size:** Average class size: 19; Range 15-40
- **Language class size:** Usually no more than 12
- **Pre-Registration in classes:** Done during the pre-registration period as specified on the AUI academic calendar
- **Attendance:** Mandatory class attendance

Arrival, Departure and Orientation

Arrival: International students should arrive at AUI in time to take part in the new student orientation program. Exchange and study abroad students can be pickup up at Fez airport or train station.

Orientation: Students pay the orientation and other relevant fees upon arrival at AUI. Attendance is mandatory for all incoming international students.

Departure: Students should plan to leave AUI within 2 days after the regularly scheduled last day of final exams.

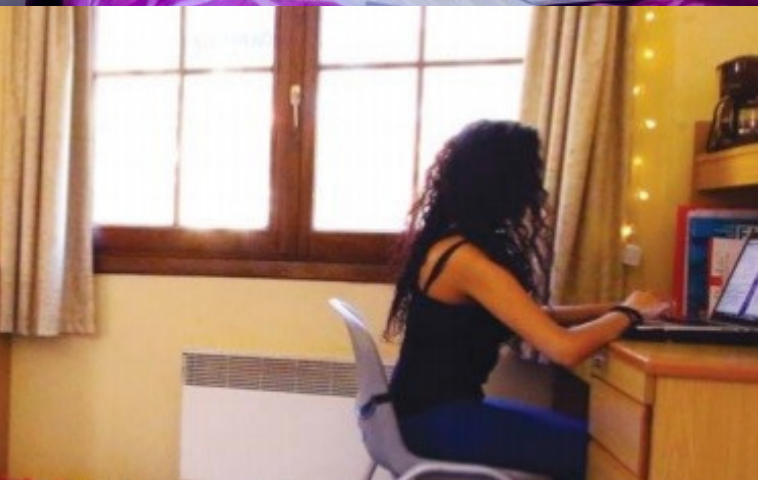
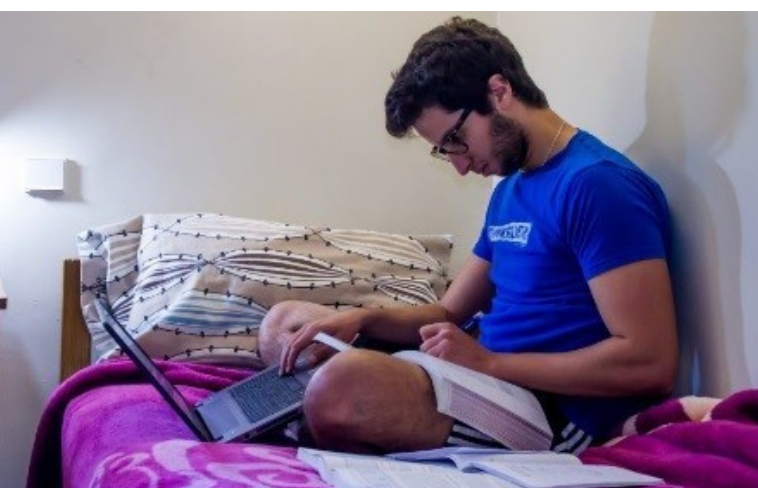

HOUSING AND CAMPUS LIFE

Living on the campus is one of the most exciting parts of moving to AUI. Being a member within the community provides opportunities for students to attend, participate and organize a wide array of programs and activities. On-campus housing helps you become more involved in the college experience, coherently incorporating classroom work with co-curricular activities that support your ambition and goals. Our student dormitories feature modern amenities and stunning views of the surrounding cedar forest. They also include heating systems, wired and wireless internet, kitchens, laundry services, and study lounges.



ACCOMMODATION ON CAMPUS

All exchange and study abroad students are, with only very rare exceptions, required to live in university housing on the campus. Normally, housing is based on double occupancy, and every effort is made to pair international students with a Moroccan counterpart. Single rooms are not generally available. Housing for married couples, with or without children, is not normally available but may be possible on a case-by-case basis. There is a charge for housing during end of semester breaks. This fee will be based on the daily rate for the room. Students may be able to store belongings during the break between semesters.

RULES AND REGULATIONS:

- 1) Strict sex segregation in dormitories; entering opposite-sex dorms results in disciplinary action, possibly expulsion. Exceptions are limited to certain campus areas.*
- 2) Prohibition of illegal drugs and alcohol on campus, with violations leading to disciplinary action, including expulsion.*
- 3) Weeknight curfew from Sunday to Thursday at midnight; breaking curfew may lead to disciplinary measures.*

COURSE OFFERINGS

Al Akhawayn University offers a variety of courses. International students can register in any of the courses offered by the university's schools; School of Science and Engineering, School of Business Administration, and School of Humanities & Social Sciences. Courses offered can be found in the Catalog.

Please note that not all courses are offered every semester.

• LANGUAGE COURSES

Language courses offered: Arabic - French - Spanish - Turkish - German - Korean - sometimes Tamazight are offered each semester.

A placement test during the orientation and registration period is required for any student requesting a language course after the beginning level. If there are **less than 5 students**, a course may not be offered but every reasonable attempt will be made to accommodate international students. Very advanced students of French will be placed into classes of Moroccan students polishing their languages skills in French as second language learners which are labeled FRN. French as a foreigner language are labeled FRE. International students/nonnative speakers of Arabic normally only register in Arabic classes labeled ARA. Very advanced learners of Arabic may be placed in to classes labeled ARB with Moroccan and other students of native or near native ability. Intensive Arabic courses are only offered in the summer as part of the Arabic and North African Studies summer program.
