- The university began its activities with 90 students and 28 professors.
- It was one of the first private universities of Argentina.
- In **1992**, the iconic university building was inaugurated in the City of Buenos Aires.

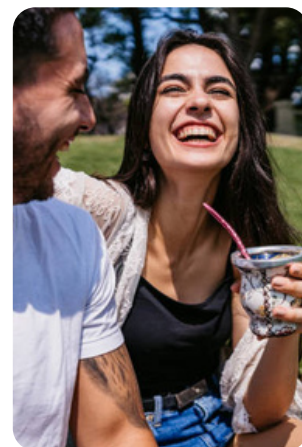

Argentine identity

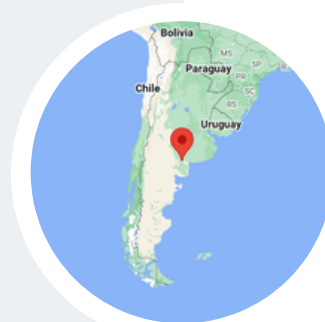
Land of migrants and native settlers, Argentina is a mixture of cultures and traditions. Our essence is to be a country of open doors that warmly welcomes travelers and tourists from all over the world.



What characterizes the country?

Location and geography: Located in the south of Latin America, Argentina is bordered by Bolivia, Brazil, Uruguay, Paraguay and Chile.

The country has plains, jungles, forests, mountains and deserts. All of this due to its large surface area. It is the **8th** largest country in the world and the **1st** in Hispanic America.



Climate and seasons: Due to its location and extension all 4 seasons can be experienced.

Spring-Summer season: from September to March
Fall-Winter season: from March to September

Biodiversity: Many of its natural sites were declared as protective areas and national parks and some of them were even recognized as World Heritage Sites by UNESCO.

Argentina, jointly with Brazil, shares one of the **7 Natural Wonders of the World**: the Iguazu Falls.



Gastronomy: The popular cuisine and the most elaborate culinary arts coexist in the Argentinean gastronomic offer. The local cuisine is constantly influenced by the different immigrants who settle in the country.

Music: In addition to traditional music such as tango, milonga and folklore, there is an important influence of rock, jazz and blues, without forgetting popular rhythms such as *cumbia* and *cuarteto*.

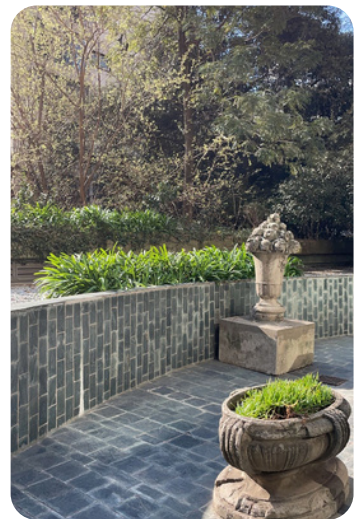

- The **2nd semester** goes from August to November, with final exams in November and December.
- Also, in February there is another exam session.

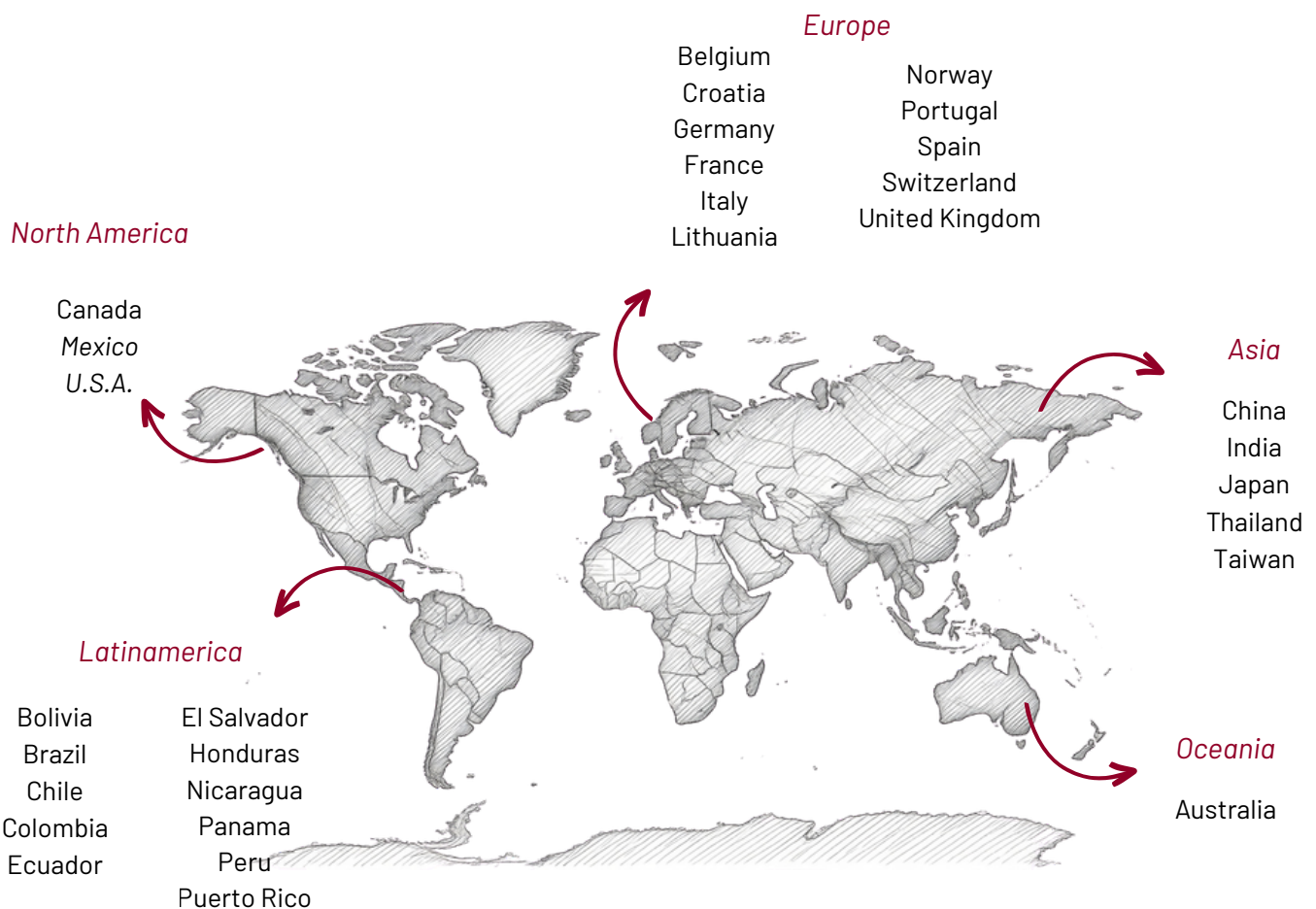
Winter vacations are usually the last week of July and summer vacations tend to last the whole month of January.

Semester programs

Immersion Program (IP)

- The program offers international students with an advanced level of Spanish the opportunity to take [undergraduate](#), [graduate](#) and [technical](#) courses with local students.
- IP takes place twice a year.
- Students may enroll for either one semester or the full academic year.
- No tuition fees apply to students from partner universities.



Argentine and Latin American Studies Program (PEAL/PALAS)

- The **PEAL** (taught in Spanish) offers introductory upper division courses in cultural studies, social sciences, literature, popular culture, history, tango, film, service learning, and linguistics, all of which focus specifically on Argentina and Latin America
- The **PALAS** (taught in English) offers introductory upper division courses in economy, cultural studies, political science, social sciences, human rights, gender history, literature, history and film.
- It is held twice a year.
- It includes language courses to learn Spanish (intermediate or advanced level) or Portuguese.
- No tuition fees apply to students from partner universities.



Maymester

Boat-building workshop

This three-week, 60-hour intensive workshop offers a rare opportunity to engage in the traditional craft of boat building.

Nursing Spanish

- This three-week Nursing Spanish Immersion Program is designed to enhance students' professional and linguistic skills.
- Intensive practice is structured in two ways: through clinical rotations at Hospital Alemán each morning and Spanish classes each afternoon.
- All students must demonstrate an upper-intermediate Spanish level by successfully passing a written and oral placement test online to be eligible for the program, which requires a minimum of eight students to open.



Spanish as a Second Language (SSL)

- This is a 2-week Spanish course with complete immersion in Argentine life and culture.
- Depending on the results of the placement exam, the students will be recommended to join the appropriate course (intermediate or advanced).



Act of Sight

- This intensive two-week program explores the “point of view” as the origin of artistic creation, combining critical thinking, creativity, and observation through art, design, literature, cinema, and landscape.
- Through immersive experiences in Buenos Aires and the UNESCO World Heritage site of Quebrada de Humahuaca, students will develop their own creative gaze by engaging with urban culture, monumental nature, and local traditions.



Color Theory and Application in Architecture and Design

- This intensive 4-week program uses Buenos Aires as an urban laboratory to explore the theory, perception, and cultural significance of color through a combination of academic study, studio practice, and immersive fieldwork.
- Through site visits, independent research, and a special study trip to the James Turrell Museum in Salta, students will analyze the relationship between color, light, architecture, and space in both urban and natural environments.



Summer Programs

Summer PALAS: The Argentine DNA- Culture and the Market

- This six-week summer program combines two upper-division courses to examine how culture, identity, and historical resilience shape business and social dynamics in Argentina.
- Through theoretical classes, curated visits in Buenos Aires, and an immersive field experience in Jujuy during the Fiesta de la Pachamama, students will explore the relationship between markets, cultural practices, entrepreneurship, and regional development.



Summer PEAL: The Argentine DNA - Culture and the Media

- This five-week summer program combines two 300-level courses and 120 contact hours to explore Argentine culture, urban identity, literature, and media production through immersive learning in Buenos Aires.
- Blending classroom instruction with fieldwork and hands-on creative projects, students will strengthen their Spanish skills while analyzing the city as a living cultural text through film, photography, podcasts, and direct engagement with local communities.



Medical Spanish Immersion Program

- This five-week Medical Spanish Immersion program combines advanced Spanish instruction with supervised clinical observation at leading healthcare institutions in Buenos Aires, including FLENI and Swiss Medical.



- Designed for premedical students and health professionals, the program integrates classroom learning, medical terminology, and cultural competency with hands-on hospital shadowing to strengthen communication skills and provide insight into the Argentine healthcare system.



Health Psychology

- This is a monthly Spanish course with complete immersion in Argentine. This 60-hour program explores Health Psychology through a biopsychosocial approach, examining how biological, psychological, and social factors influence health, illness, and patient care.
- Combining theoretical instruction, clinical case studies, classroom discussions, and fieldwork in Buenos Aires—including observation of equinotherapy practices—students will analyze contemporary approaches to stress management, chronic illness, psychosomatic care, and public health intervention.



Spanish as a Second Language

- This is a monthly Spanish course with complete immersion in Argentine life and culture.
- Depending on the results of the placement exam, students will be recommended to join the appropriate course (intermediate or advanced).
- Course capacity is limited to 15 students. A minimum of students is required for each course.



The programs **Spanish as a Second Language** and **Color Theory and Application in Architecture and Design** are offered during the Maymester term and are also available as part of the Summer Session.
