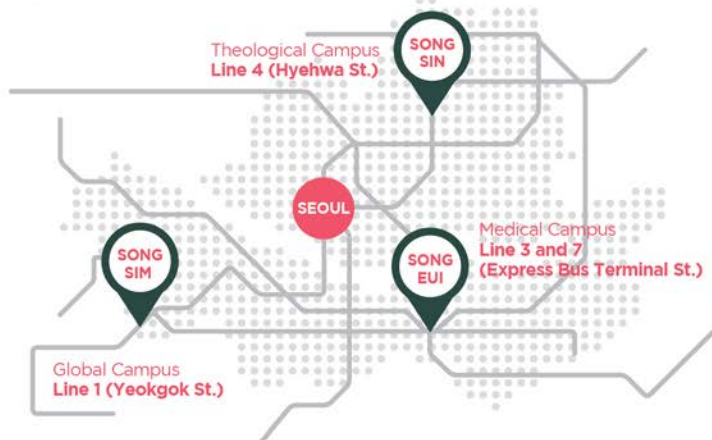

The sixth week focuses on slavery in the US and the US Civil War. The seventh week focuses the post-Civil War rapid US economic development. The eighth week is for midterm tests. The ninth week focuses on the Progressive movement and leads into the impact of US participation in the First World War on the US domestically. The tenth week focuses on the Great Depression/New Deal and American participation in World War II during the Roosevelt Administration.
