ÖREBRO UNIVERSITY

Örebro University was granted full university status in 1999 and is now one of Sweden's most expansive universities, with 17,000 students and 1,600 staff. Exchange students can choose from a wide range of courses in various subjects, all taught in English.



NOMINATION AND APPLICATION PROCEDURE

Every year, we welcome around 400 exchange students. You apply online and the application window is open for four weeks each semester. Please note that exchange students need to be officially nominated by their home university. All partner universities are notified when the online nomination form opens. The application for admission and housing is online. The only supporting document needed is a transcript in English stating all courses, grades and credits at university level. However, for students applying for music courses, recordings are also required.

IMPORTANT DATES

There are no official breaks during the semesters and no breaks between the autumn and spring semesters.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS

Students who wish to study at Swedish universities need to have a knowledge of English corresponding to level B2 on the CEFR scale.

STUDY SYSTEM

At Swedish universities, courses and modules are mainly studied one at a time. For example, a student takes a full-time course of 7.5 ECTS credits for five weeks, which also includes examination. When the course is completed, the student takes up the next course. Studies are measured in ECTS credits and 1.5 ECTS credits are equivalent to one week of full-time study.

COURSES AND COURSE LOAD

Exchange students must be full-time students and take 30 ECTS credits per semester. Exchange students can choose from across the range of courses offered in English at Örebro University, as long as they meet the prerequisites and as long as the courses are not full. HOUSING

All exchange students are guaranteed student accommodation provided that we have received the application on time. All student accommodation has shops, health-care centres and other services within easy reach. The cost for housing is 27.500–34.500 SEK (approx. 2.500–3.100 EUR/2.900–3.600 USD)* on semester basis.

COST OF LIVING

The average cost of living per month is around 11.000 SEK (approx. 1.000 EUR / 1.100 USD)* including rent.

INSURANCE

All incoming exchange students are covered by the insurance Student IN, supplied by Kammarkollegiet (The Legal, Financial and Administrative Services Agency). The insurance is limited and covers for example necessary and reasonable costs for emergency medical or dental care if the insured suffers illness or has an accident during the policy term. EU/EEA students should primarily use the European Health Insurance Card issued in their home countries. Please read the terms and conditions carefully. An additional insurance might be necessary. Örebro University is one of nine European universities forming the NEOLAIA alliance. The other universities are the universities of; Bielefeld (Germany), Ostrava (Czech Republic), Tours (France), Jaen (Spain), Salerno (Italy), Suceava (Romania), Nicosia (Cyprus) and Siauliai (Lithuania).

- One health: Challenges and solutions at a regional scale.

ÖREBRO

Only two hours away from Stockholm, in the heart of Sweden, is Örebro: the 7th largest town in Sweden with a population of 160,000. It is rapidly growing, while still maintaining its small-town feeling.
