Programme Highlights:	Students are presented with two tracks ("Business in Korean perspective" and "Korean Studies"), each offering a distinct set of course options. Each track consists of two courses, with each course worth 3 credits. Students can take 1 to 2 courses. Cultural Activities: Field trips, Welcome & farewell parties, Design Your Own Seoul" days (including two-day free-pass ticket), Interaction with Korean Peer Advocates.

Programme Fee:	KRW2,400,000 (Around HK\$ 13,000) Upon successful completion of the programme, Lingnan will provide a programme fee subsidy of HK\$4,000. Remarks: 1. Application, tuition, cultural activities, and accommodation fees are included. 2. Programme fee is subject to fluctuation of exchange rate and final confirmation by OGE. 3. On top of the programme fees, you have to pay for visa, insurance, meals & other miscellaneous items.
