Expressivist Confucianism: Objectivity and Early Confucian Metaethics

Several recent interpretive controversies over Confucian metaethics concern the nature of moral properties. Specifically, they concern whether the Confucians Mengzi and Xunzi believed moral properties are objective and mind-independent or constructed, subjective, or otherwise mind-dependent. In this paper, I argue against the cognitivist framework assumed in this debate and offer instead a noncognitivist, expressivist framework for understanding early Confucian morality. The expressivist framework dissolves the interpretive tension between different accounts of moral

endorsement and rejection in early Confucian ethics instead of a cognitivist, representational framework of moral beliefs and metaphysically substantive moral properties. It also locates new metaethical ambiguities within early Confucian ethics that better reflect the concerns of the early Confucians.
