## **Brief Course Description**

In this course, students will study Contemporary Neo-Confucianism as one of the most significant intellectual responses to the cultural crises since China started her modernisation in the 19<sup>th</sup> century. This school of thought is significant not only because it comprises various major thinkers in facing the crises of Chinese culture, but also because it develops and deepens itself over time.

Apart from introducing the common views and beliefs shared by the Contemporary Neo-Confucian thinkers, this course will focus discussing the individual thoughts of Mou Zongsan, Tang Junyi and Xu Fuguan. Finally, the course will examine the possible development of Contemporary Neo-Confucianism in order to evaluate how it tackles cultural ethical issues as well as issues of nationalism in the contemporary world.

#### Aims

This course aims at providing student with the understanding of the cultural crises of China in late 19<sup>th</sup> century and the responses of it from the important Contemporary Neo-Confucian thinkers. It also aims at examining the philosophy of Contemporary Neo-Confucianism as inherited as well as developed from classical Confucianism.

# **Learning Outcomes**

At the end of the course, students are expected to grasp Contemporary Neo-Confucianism's stand with regard to the following issues: How should we understand and evaluate the essential characteristics of traditional Chinese culture? (LO1) They should evaluate traditional Chinese culture critically hence can answer the following questions: Is the value system in traditional Chinese culture compatible with that of the modern world? To what extent can Western civilisation benefit the transformation of Chinese culture? How can traditional Chinese culture contribute to the process of modernisation? (LO2) They should reflect on the following issue: How does the philosophy of Contemporary Neo-Confucianism contribute to resolve philosophical issues in Western philosophy? (LO3)

  - c. The challenge by Western civilization
  - d. The evaluation of Western civilization
  - e. The contribution of traditional Chinese culture to the process of modernization
- 4. The Thought of Tang Junyi
- 5. The Thought of Mou Zongsan
- 6. The Thought of Xu Fuguan
- 7. The possible development of Contemporary Neo-Confucianism
- 8. The Critique of Contemporary Neo-Confucianism

# **Teaching Method**

Lecture and tutorial

## **Measurement of Learning Outcomes**

- 1. Students will give oral presentation on assigned topic in the tutorials. They are expected to be able to analyse and synthesize various points of view on the understanding and evaluation of the essential characteristics of traditional Chinese culture. They are also expected to discuss in depth how traditional Chinese culture contribute to the process of modernization. (LO1; LO2)
- 2. Students will write a term paper. They are expected to consolidate the knowledge they have learned in this course. They will discuss issues such as whether the value system in traditional Chinese culture compatible with that of the modern world and to what extent Western civilisation can benefit the transformation of Chinese culture. They should be able to draw on a range of sources in making judgments. (LO2; LO3)
- 3. Examination will assess students' general knowledge of the thoughts of Contemporary Neo-Confucianism. Students should be able to show their understanding and reflection of issues involved in the subject. (LO2; LO3)
