

Minor in Creative Technologies in Music and Community

The Minor in Creative Technologies in Music and Community programme is hosted by the Wong Bing Lai Music and Performing Arts Unit. This Minor programme is for undergraduates eager to merge the application of music with the supporting use of Generative AI. Focusing on creative AI applications in music for community engagement, this programme will offer students a unique blend of technology and artistry for societal impact.

All undergraduate students may qualify for a Minor in Creative Technologies in Music and Community after successful completion of two required courses (6 credits) and three elective courses (9 credits) as detailed below.
