* Students are assigned to take CCC8011, CCC8012 and CCC8015 in the first year, and CCC8013 and CCC8014 in the second year.

Under the revamped English Language Enhancement (ELE) programme, students will be grouped under two streams. Group A students are those who obtained level 3 in HKDSE English or equivalent while Group B students are those who obtained level 4 or above in HKDSE English or equivalent. Students are encouraged to take their first required ELE course, viz. LUE1001 for Group A and LUE1002 for Group B, in First Term of Year 1. However, they are given the flexibility to take the respective courses in Second Term of Year 1. For Group A students who take LUE1001 in Second Term of Year 1, they should take LUE1002 in First Term of Year 2. ** Students are assigned to take ADA1003, FVA2107 and FVA2108 in the first year, and FVA2105, FVA2109 and FVA3005 in the second year. Year 1 and 2 students are not allowed to drop these required courses in the designated terms/years, unless an approval is granted by the Head of the Department on special circumstances. For students directly admitted to Year 2 or Year 3, the six required courses will be assigned in their first and second year of studies at Lingnan with necessary adjustments.

Special Note for Students Designated as Year 3 Students Upon Admission:

Students are assigned to take CCC8011, CCC8012, CCC8013 and CCC8014 in the third year. In addition, students are required to complete 5 Cluster courses (instead of 4 Cluster courses) in total.

The capstone project to be carried out in the final year is compulsory. Before registering for the capstone project, the student should have completed all required courses. Year 4 students of FVA major will work individually or in groups under supervision and adopt one of the following approaches to undertake the capstone project:
