Brief Course Description:

This capstone course will pull together the skills and experiences gained through previous course work to allow students to apply these a project that addresses a community need related to a scientific issue/issues

Aims:

The aim of this capstone course is to allow students to apply their science knowledge and science literacy skills in a real-world situation.

Learning Outcomes (LOs):

Upon completion of this course, students will be able to:

- 1. Explain and analyze the scientific concepts relevant to issues of local concern.
- 2. Identify the knowledge, needs, intentions, responsibilities and expectations of different stakeholders.
- 3. Clearly articulate the constraints and trade-offs inherent in the system.
- 4. Design, conduct, and analyze the effectiveness of project/programme designed to address a local science-related issue/need.
- 5. Communicate clearly with a variety of stakeholders.
- 6. Reflect about the role of science and science literacy in modern society.

Indicative Contents:

Varies depending on project.

Teaching Method:

Students are required to submit drafts at various stages and undertake individual research, meeting their academic supervisors at regular intervals.
