Brief Course Description

In collaboration with the partnering institutions and research networks of Lingnan University, an international symposium or annual seminar series will be organised at Lingnan University to engage students enrolling in the BSocSci in Public Management and Smart Governance programme (2 year part-time) to participate in research event to enhance their learning and research experiences. Throughout the international symposium or annual seminar series, students would have the opportunity to learn from leading researchers in the urban affairs management and policy studies. Research and policy dialogue among scholars and practitioners coming from the Asia Pacific region will focus on the main themes of city research and social policy. Special panels will be organised in the symposium or seminar to allow students to present their own researches. Additional seminars will be organised after the international event to allow students to organise and reflect their learning after attending the international event, with particular reference to build the links between what they are planning to research in their future study and the discussions highlighted in the international event.

Aims

To enhance student international learning experience through engaging them to actively participating in the international event. Students will be exposed to high level discussions during the symposium or seminar and they could also engage in policy and research dialogue with leading scholars and practitioners from other regions in the urban affairs management and policy studies fields.

Learning Outcomes (LOs)

Upon completion of this course, successful students will be able to:

- 1) Demonstrate appreciation of the international conference experience through active participation in the annual international symposium or seminar series;
- 2) Understand the most recent development and issues on urban affairs management and social policy confronted Asia Pacific region through listening to presentations from invited speakers in the international event;
- 3) Analyse major social policy responses in managing rapid social, economic, demographic and political changes in Asia Pacific by acting as discussants in the symposium or seminar series;
- 4) Build the links between what they propose to research and the discussions highlighted in the international symposium or seminar series; and
- 5) Establish a network of learning community in Asia Pacific for further research in urban

affairs management and policy studies.

Teaching Method

- 1) Discussion in international symposium or seminar series. Students will participate in major presentations by scholars and practitioners coming from the Asia Pacific region and especially Guangdong-Hong Kong-Macao Greater Bay Area during the international event, followed by discussion.
- 2) Reflection of learning in de-briefing seminars. Each student is required to submit a reflective journal (minimum 2,000 words) based on their field observations and field visits.

Readings

Readings will be assigned when topics/themes of the international symposium or seminar series are decided upon annually. Since the international symposium or seminar series is guided by a special concept paper for discussion and presentation, students will be well informed before the event takes place.

Important Notes:

1. Students are expected to spend a total of 120 hours, including preparation for and attending symposium and/or seminar series, and personal study hours to achieve the course learning outcomes.
2.
