V. Tuition Fee

Non-final year students	Final year students, <i>i.e. Students who will fulfil graduation requirements AFTER Term 2, 2025-26</i>
Credits of courses taken in a summer term will be counted in the maximum study load of the CURRENT academic year. If there are excess credits, they will be counted in the maximum study load for the FOLLOWING academic year^(Note 1) and students are NOT required to pay the tuition fees ^(Note 2). For students who are on suspension in Term 2/both Terms 1 & 2, they are required to inform the Registry in writing in advance to confirm their resumption of studies in a summer term for necessary arrangements. Credits taken in a summer term will be counted in the maximum study load for the FOLLOWING academic year.	Students are required to pay the tuition fees, irrespective of having any remaining credits in their final year of study. They will be notified by email individually after their assessment results for Term 2 are confirmed, starting from mid-June 2026. The payment deadline is normally 1 week after the issuance of tuition fee notification. Meanwhile, the grade and credits will NOT be included as part of the degree study. <u>Tuition Fees:</u> ➤ 3-credit course or language course: HK\$ 5,000 ➤ 1-credit course: HK\$ 1,700
Students on International or Mainland exchange programme	
Students are required to provide their credits information based on their current study/approved study plan for deciding whether they are required to pay the tuition fees.	

Notes:

1. For example, if a non-first year student has enrolled a total of 30 credits in Terms 1 and 2 of 2025-26, he/she may take up to 3 credits in Summer, *i.e. maximum annual study load minus actual enrolled credits in Terms 1 & 2 = 33 - 30*. If he/she ends up taking 6 credits in a summer term, 3 credits will be counted in the maximum study load for the following academic year.
2. In exceptional circumstances, approval can be granted by the Programme Director/Head of Department for a student to take up to **two** courses in a summer term with payment upon recommendation of the academic adviser concerned. Notwithstanding Regulation 8.6, credits of paid courses in summer term(s), if any, will not be counted in the maximum study load for the academic year or in the next academic year.

VI. Study Load

- LU students can take a maximum of **TWO** courses or **SIX** credits in Sessions 1 and 2 (including language courses).

VII. Application for Accommodation
